The organization exercising statutory regulatory authority over the podiatry profession is the New Brunswick Podiatry Association Inc.

The legislated scope of practice under the Podiatry Act is described as follows

“podiatry” means the practice of podiatry and includes that field of medicine which strives to improve the overall health and well-being of patients by focusing on preventing, diagnosing and treating conditions associated with the foot and ankle by practising on the lower extremities using modalities which may include medical, biomechanical and surgical means; (podiatrie)”.

The legislated “Authorized Acts” of the profession are listed in the Act as follows:

- ❖ prescribing drugs designated in the by-laws, rules or regulations;
- ❖ administering, by inhalation, a substance designated in the by-laws, rules or regulations;
- ❖ administering, by injection into feet, a substance designated in the by-laws, rules or regulations; and
- ❖ cutting into subcutaneous tissues of the foot.
