



SASKATCHEWAN

In Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan College of Podiatry is the statutory regulator of the profession. Under the Podiatry Act

“Podiatry is defined as the primary health care discipline concerned with the diagnosis and treatment of disorders and injuries and anatomic defects of the human foot.

Podiatry primarily concerns itself with the diagnosis and treatment of diseases and disorders of the skin and nails of the human foot, local manifestations of systemic diseases in the human foot and underlying foot pathomechanics and gait anomalies.”

The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan may, pursuant to its By-Laws, issue “podiatric surgery permits” to practitioners who hold a DPM degree from a program recognized by the BC College of Physicians and Surgeons, and has successfully completed all parts of the American Podiatric Medical Licensing Examination and a minimum of two years residency at a Council on Podiatric Medical Education accredited or approved residency.
